## "Johnny Green: An Orphan's Survival 1841-1920"

presented by **Ethan Sullivan Smith**  
**November 9, 2010**

Johnny Green was 19 when the Civil War broke out, and was one of the only soldiers in the Orphan Brigade alive when it ended. Orphan Brigade soldiers were unable to return to their home state of Kentucky until the war was over – lest they be tried for treason – because they chose to fight for the Confederacy. Green's story as detailed in a journal he wrote for his daughter's years later, provides extraordinary accounts of courage and bravery, and Ethan Smith's Chautauqua brings the story of the Orphan Brigade to life.

Ethan Sullivan Smith first started doing plays at the age of six at Georgetown College Theatre. He then competed in speech throughout middle school and was a prose interpretation and public speaking champion. He was accepted into the Chautauqua Program of the Kentucky Humanities council when he was thirteen and began portraying Price Hollowell. From sophomore through senior year of high school, he was home schooled and is currently a student at Georgetown College.

## Methodology and a Case Study: African American Genealogy/Slave Research November 6, 2010
