For the past 25 years, the Office of the Secretary of State has held a statewide Essay and Slogan Contest for Kentucky students. The discourse this contest stimulates among students is all the more important in light of waning voter trends in the youngest demographics. The contest is an excellent way to garner recognition for your students, and it helps them tangibly interact with the concepts associated with government and democracy.

Students in grades 6-8 are invited to participate in the voter slogan contest, and students in grades 9-12 are encouraged to take part in the essay portion of the contest. I encourage you to distribute the web address listed below and use this project in your classes or with individual students to generate cross-curriculum writing ideas.

Prizes will be awarded for first, second, and third places in the slogan contest, which is open to all 6th - 8th graders. In the essay contest, a first-place prize will be awarded for each high school grade level. The monetary awards for contest winners are made possible by contributions from KEA and KEA Retired, Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education, the University of Kentucky Scripps Howards First Amendment Center, the Kentucky Department of Education, and ECU Center for Appalachian Regional Engagement and Stewardship (CARES). The University of Kentucky also will assist in judging the essay portion of the contest. I am grateful to our partners for their generous sponsorships of this program.

Slogan Contest Rules and Prompt
25th Annual Slogan and Essay Contest

1. The slogan contest is open to all Kentucky students in grades 6-8.
2. Slogan entry is limited to one per student.
3. Students must submit their slogans on the enclosed entry form. All sections of the entry form must be completed.
4. Students may submit their slogans online at www.sos.ky.gov/contests or by mail to the address below.
5. All entries must be submitted electronically by 5 p.m. (EST) Monday, December 2, 2013, or postmarked by that date, to be eligible for consideration.
6. Entries become the property of the Kentucky Secretary of State's Office and may be used for other purposes with credit to the author. Winning entries will be posted on the Secretary of State's website and may be used for other civic-related material.
7. All guidelines must be met for any entry to be considered by contest judges.

Slogan Prompt: Write a slogan that addresses the importance of voting, voter registration, and/or elections in Kentucky.

For judging purposes, the slogan must be an attention-getting word or phrase that expresses the importance of eligible Kentuckians participating in local, state, and national elections by registering and going to the polls, or the democratic freedom of participating in elections.
