CALL TO ORDER

Shawn Oak called the meeting to order at 12:02 p.m.

NEW BUSINESS

Dr. Oak notified the board that since the Special Meeting held on March 19, 2020, the board received a letter addressed to Governor Beshear from U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Secretary Alex M. Azar II. Secretary Azar had asked Governor Beshear help facilitate allowing health professionals to practice via telehealth, to waive regulatory standards that prevented this, and to relax scope of practice during the COVID-19 crisis.

Based on the information received from HHS, the Board Attorney notified the board that it could make the following motion:

Motion to suspend 201 KAR 32:110E, Section 3(1) requiring licensed marriage and family therapists and marriage and family therapy associates providing telehealth services in this state to have completed 15 hours of board-approved training. During state of emergency declared on March 6, 2020, by Executive Order 2020-215, licensed marriage and family therapists and marriage and family therapy associates may provide telehealth services in this state without having to complete 15 hours of board-approve training. Marriage and family therapists and marriage and family therapy associates who have not completed 15 hours of board-approved training are encourage to get the training as soon as possible and familiarize themselves with the Telehealth regulation. This suspension will only last until the Governor declares that the state of emergency declared on March 6, 2020, by Executive Order 2020-215, has ceased.

Scott Kaminsky made the motion, and Fred Stickle seconded; motion carried.

Based on the information received from HHS, the Board Attorney notified the board that it could make the following motion:

Motion to suspend 201 KAR 32:110E, Section 3(1) requiring a licensed marriage and family therapist who is supervising a marriage and family therapy associate providing telehealth services in this state to have completed 15 hours of board-approved training in the practice of telehealth. During state of emergency

declared on March 6, 2020, by Executive Order 2020-215, licensed marriage and family therapists supervising a marriage and family therapy associates may provide supervision without having to complete 15 hours of board-approve training. Marriage and family therapists who are supervising marriage and family therapy associates proving telehealth services in this case who have not completed 15 hours of board-approved training are encourage to get the training as soon as possible and familiarize themselves the Telehealth regulation. This suspension will only last until the Governor declares that the state of emergency declared on March 6, 2020, by Executive Order 2020-215, has ceased. Scott Kaminsky made the motion, and Fred Stickle seconded; motion carried.

Based on the information received from HHS, the Board Attorney notified the board that it could make the following motion:

Motion to suspend 201 KAR 32:110E, Section 8 requiring compliance with HIPAA and HITECH. Following the lead of the HHS, during state of emergency declared on March 6, 2020, by Executive Order 2020-215, licensed marriage and family therapists, marriage and family therapy associates, and licensees who supervise associates may seek to communicate with patients, and provide telehealth services, through remote communications technologies even if these technologies, and the manner in which they are used, may not fully comply with the requirements of the HIPAA and HITECH Rules. The Board will exercise its enforcement discretion and will not impose penalties for noncompliance with the regulatory requirements under 201 KAR 32:110, Section against licensees and associates in connection with the good faith provision of telehealth during the state of emergency declared on March 6, 2020, by Executive Order 2020-215. This suspension will only last until the Governor declares that the state of emergency declared on March 6, 2020, by Executive Order 2020-215, has ceased. Fred Stickle made the motion, and John Embry seconded; motion carried.
