RE: Voter Registration Record Cleanup Activities Comprehensive Activity Report
DATE: July 1, 2026

Pursuant to KRS 116.114, I am providing a comprehensive activity report regarding voter registration record cleanup activities for the preceding fiscal year.

The State Board of Elections maintains Kentucky's statewide voter registration database, but it is the responsibility of Kentucky's 120 county clerks to receive registration of voters. KRS 116.045(2). Kentucky law allows for a person to register to vote in person, by mail, by means of the federal postcard application, by mail-in application (prescribed by the federal Election Assistance Commission) and by other means approved by the State Board of Elections. KRS 116.045(4). Through Kentucky statute and the National Voter Registration Act ("NVRA"), voters may also register at the time of receiving or renewing their driver's license or at designated voter registration agencies: social service agencies, armed forces recruitment offices, and disability service agencies. KRS 116.0455, 31 KAR 3:020. The State Board of Elections maintains monthly registration counts from each agency listed above on its website at <https://elect.ky.gov/Resources/Pages/Motor-Voter.aspx>. The primary origin of registration is driver's licensing offices.

Kentucky law requires the removal of a voter's name by the State Board of Elections upon the notice of death, declaration of incompetency, excusal from jury duty due to not being a citizen of the United States, conviction of felony, or out-of-state registration. KRS 116.113. The State Board of Elections is in contact with state agencies, sometimes daily, to receive this information (Vital Statistics, Department of Corrections, Administrative Office of the Courts, Department of Driver's Licensing, as well as the federal courts). The State Board of Elections uses information from the U.S. Postal Service to identify voters who may have moved and thus initiate the NVRA list maintenance provisions, and receives notifications from the Electronic Registration Information Center regarding in-state and out-of-state moves, deaths (social security) and potential duplicates.

Both the Secretary of State and State Board of Elections, on their respective websites, present to the public information regarding the voter registration record cleanup required by KRS 116.114. After publishing the initial Voter Residency List in April 2025 and publishing the updated list in 2026, the Secretary of State has yet to receive any reports of anomalies at any address or reports of multiple people registered at the same address with same age and minor variations. Should such reports come, the Secretary of State looks forward to working with the Attorney General's Unit of Election Investigations and Security, established by the adoption of KRS 15.112.

The voter registration removals for the past year (June 2025 to June 2026) include the following:

- Deceased – 46,443
- Felon – 6022
- Incompetent – 742
- Moved Out of State – 4200
- At Voter Request – 602
- Duplicates – 377
- Non-Citizen - 169
- Other – 0
- Inactive Purge – 0

Kentucky remains a member of the Electronic Registration Information Center (“ERIC”). The membership was required by a Consent Decree entered into in 2018. Although the Consent Decree expired March 31, 2025, membership with ERIC has been beneficial by providing access to the Social Security Master Death Index for immediate removal of Kentucky voters who have died outside of the Commonwealth. ERIC also shares information with member-states of voters who have registered in another state or received a driver's license in another state after their voter registration in Kentucky. This allows Kentucky to send those voters a notification under the NVRA to begin the voter removal process. Since 2024, Kentucky has been provided an exemption from the requirement to send a notification to eligible but unregistered voters and the ERIC Board voted in 2025 to make this a voluntary action.

The State Board of Elections has entered into cross-state agreements with the following states to share voter registration information in order to identify voters who may have registered to vote in another state since their registration in the Commonwealth: Ohio, Virginia, Tennessee, Missouri, West Virginia, Alabama, Mississippi, and Texas.
